Hi All,

I met with Marty Brennan last week to discuss the nitty-gritty of eScholarship. He has proposed that our department could be a pilot site for rolling out Open UCLA, which will be launching soon. I am awaiting some materials from him, which I'll put into a report outlining options, along with pros and cons. We talked about how being a leader in Open UCLA compliance could raise the visibility of the IS Dept at a time when we

need to elevate our reputation and assure Campus that we are making great strides in key initiatives. I stressed the importance of minimizing the time and effort required for adhering to UCLA's open access policy for both faculty and staff. We discussed the potential for automated prompts like those used by Researchgate, which make it much easier for faculty to participate. The algorithm finds articles likely written by the faculty member and asks whether he/she is the author. One advantage of being a guinea pig is that they (the eScholarship team) would help us get existing articles into the database, so we would be able to continue with very little effort. Anyway, I'll share more when I get the specific details from Marty. I made no commitments, just fact finding.
