Inspired by the success of the Centennial Campaign for
UCLA, the Academic Senate's Committee on
Development and the Office of External Affairs are
working together to reimagine faculty and development
staff collaboration in fundraising across campus. As part
of this effort, we would like to ask for your help in
identifying a few particularly promising candidates for
participation in a two-part series of targeted coaching

sessions that we will be co-sponsoring in winter 2020.

In contrast to development events in previous years, which were broad in scope and open to all Senate faculty, these sessions, conceived as a pilot program, will be selective and tightly focused. Our goals are: first, to help motivated faculty deepen their understanding of development; second, to provide concrete coaching on specific projects; and third, to forge meaningful connections among faculty with an interest in fundraising from across campus, and among motivated faculty and development staff.

Nothing like this pilot program has ever been attempted at UCLA, and we are excited by the potential it has to bridge the persistent gap between faculty and development activities.

We are asking for your guidance in nominating faculty because you are in a unique position to identify areas of strategic development in your unit, as well as motivated faculty who are committed to making the development process work better for everyone.
